

Crisis Simulations International Releases v 4.0 of its Simulation Software

April 20, 2006 – Crisis Simulations International, the leading provider of computer-based decision-making software, released v 4.0 of its patent-pending DXMA™ technology today.

Version 4.0 provides for even more realism, a complete log of decisions made during the simulation and multiple language support to enhance the depth and breadth of the decision-making training tool.

DXMA™ v 4.0 can record all actions and events that occur during each second of the simulation for later analysis. It can generate reports, including GANTT charts, for each participant in the simulation, to help them understand when and in what context they made each decision. The log provides them with an opportunity to review their choices and to recognize what to look for so they can make better decisions during a real crisis.

With version 4.0, DXMA™ becomes truly international. It supports multiple languages simultaneously, so simulation participants can see messages, instructions and relevant content in their own language. This feature, combined with DXMA™'s ability to operate via the Internet, means a simulation can involve participants in multiple countries at the same time without translators or translation delays.

This latest version can run simulations with any combination of real and virtual (computer-based) participants, allowing teams or individuals to train realistically and comprehensively without a full complement of the crisis management staff. The computer-based virtual participants' behaviors can even be tailored to replicate or imitate known individuals; it can be calibrated to take risks aggressively or act methodically and conservatively. Those in leadership roles can compare and evaluate how different decision-making styles can improve decision-making performance and event outcomes.
